


Dear smartname

We look forward to seeing you on September 21!_




UPDATE FROM LIBERIA

Plctured above are Helen Charles (left), KBNF Country Coordinator in Liberia, with Nurse Winnie Williams (right) from the maternity hospital.




Dr. Alvin Nah Doe, Liberia's inaugural neurosurgeon also came by the warehouse to pick up supplies.
